

**“*Flower Communion*” UU Fellowship
May 16, 2010 10:00 AM**

The UU Fellowship’s last service of the year is the annual Flower Communion. This special service is a symbolic ritual for UU fellowships around the world. Each person brings a flower of their choice, either from their own gardens, or from the field or roadside. When you arrive place your flower in a large vase near the front entrance. This signifies that it is by your own free will that you join with the others. The vase that contains all the flowers is a symbol of our united church fellowship. At the end of the service each person goes to the vase and takes a flower other than the one that they had brought - thus symbolizing our shared celebration in community. This communion of sharing is essential to a free people of a free religion.

On our last Sunday we will also recognize those who provided service to our fellowship this year.

The Unitarian Universalist Fellowship is located at 3116 Algoma Street, Stevens Point, WI. Services and religious education for children both start at 10:00 AM. Childcare is available during the service. The UU Fellowship is dedicated to the acceptance and participation of persons in the full range of our Fellowship and society without regard to race, age, sex, disability, sexual identity or orientation, or national origin.
