

"Immigration Reform" UU Service Nov 6th

Jim Coakley will explore "*Immigration Reform - What would Theodore Parker do?*" at the Nov 6th Unitarian Universalist Fellowship. As a Unitarian minister, Parker was very active in the struggle to abolish slavery. Many of the 19th century issues he dealt with have resurfaced in the 21st century in the form of undocumented workers and the recent laws passed in Arizona and South Carolina. What would Parker advise us to do?

Jim is beginning his third year as a part time seminarian at Meadville Lombard Theological School. He will be preaching twice a month and leading occasional Wednesday night activities as a part of his Student Ministry Rotation with SPUUF this year.
