PRESIDENTIAL NOTES

*Julia Weiser.....

It has been great to see the new faces and the children attending our services. I hope that the move to The Springs will encourage even more visitors to our Fellowship. I understand we have had a couple of inquiries about becoming members; that is really good news. I am looking forward to the programs that are planned for the next months. I think they will be thought provoking and inspiring.

The weekly Wausau newspaper The City Pages in the December 15-21 edition titled "The Church Search" explores why people choose to attend and join specific churches. The question is what plays into people's decision to join a church? At this time of year attendance is usually greater than at others. The article says "Finding a new religion, the church search, pew hopping – it's a common phenomenon in a mobile society. A large part of the population is nowhere near the church in which they were raised, both physically and often philosophically. And there's also the contingent who haven't set foot in church for a decade or more (ever) and then have children." It goes on to say that the church search is not always a question of denomination. Rabbi Dan Danson says the theology is not always the crucial issue if there are others things going for the congregation. He observes that "People have an amazing ability to filter out theological messages they don't like in a congregation they do like."

Each person has a different set of needs; sometimes it is proximity to the church, the pastor, relationships with other attendees, discussion groups, day care centers, modern liturgy and music, social justice work, and even one that is popular and growing. Paul Beckel, the minister of the UU church in Wausau is quoted as saying that choosing a church for some can be compared to choosing a house where one has a lot of wants and has to make trade offs. Some people look for churches to feel welcome and hear messages authentic to their beliefs. Some like large congregations, others like small more intimate ones.

What do these observations have to do with our Fellowship? I think that we need to be more interested in the people who walk in to our services. Besides welcoming them we could ask them why they chose to attend and what they may be seeking.

On the CD titled "Lay Leader, Drive Time Essays" prepared by the UUA one of the short talks reports that we do not need to recruit from the outside. Instead we need to follow up on those who visit us in the course of a year. In our case, that could mean more visitors than we have members. We need to attract newcomers, not repel them.

This issue of the City Pages also has an ad promoting the UU Church in Wausau and our Fellowship. Part of the text reads "Grateful for the religious pluralism which enriches and ennoble our faith, we are inspired to deepen our understanding and expand out vision." I think this applies to our visitors from whom we can learn as well as from our members.

I will keep a copy of this paper and bring it to the service on Sunday, January 8.
